Now-a-days Witch-Hunting is a widespread phenomenon in Odisha as well as other States in the Country. Although, The Odisha Prevention of Witch-Hunting Act-2013 is in force since February, 2014 still yet the Blind belief is existing in the society. To eradicate such superstitions from the mind of the people a case study is quite essential.

Objectives of the Study:

- To study the vulnerabilities of women due to witch branding in terms of collecting case studies, identifying vulnerable districts, analyzing the source its manifestation, and impact.
- To capture the notion of the people related to the practice of witch branding and suggest strategies that
- To assess the implementation status of the Odisha Prevention of Witch Hunting Act; 2013 and assess the effectiveness on law.
- To study the existing schemes and programmes and suggest possible linkages that can be made for ensuing rehabilitation to the victims and survivors.

Area of the Study:

The study would be conducted in the districts like Ganjam, Gajapati, Mayurbhanj, Sundergarh, Keonjhar, Malkangiri, Nawarangpur, Koraput, Nayagarh where there are numerous cases of rights violation due to witch branding.

Respondents of the Study:


- Victims and survivors of witch branding.

Collection of Case Study on Rights Violation due to Witch Branding: The proposed research study will include case studies from field that comprises case studies of victims of witch hunting and captures their sufferings and vulnerabilities. At least 40 cases studies of diverse nature related to the issues from various districts would be collected, compiled. While collecting these case studies the required communication standard and norm like obtaining consents in written form for publicizing their story and photographs would be collected.

Hence, as the subject matter relates to Women Folk the State Commission For Women may cause a intensive study in the Witch-Hunting issue across the vulnerable districts of Odisha in order to create Awareness among the common people to save the victims.
